The authors compared a specific model of verbal autopsy (the InterVA CRMS model by WHO) with the ultrasound-guided minimally invasive autopsies (MIA-US), in order to find its sensitivity, specificity, and most reliable cutoff.

As an advantage, the authors could compare the InterVA CRMS Verbal Autopsy Model with the best exam available during the pandemic, which was the MIA-US. As a limitation, we should consider that conventional autopsies still are the gold standard for cause of death certification, having the MIA-US limitations when compared to the gold standard.


