EVALUATION

Q 1 Please summarize the main findings of the study.

This study assessed the impacts of the pandemic in different socio-demographic groups – including 6 majors migrant groups – of the Dutch population. It examined 5 specific dimensions that could have been differentially affected in these groups and therefore provides valuable information to support targeted interventions in the most vulnerable groups.

Q2 Please highlight the limitations and strengths.

One of the major strength of this study is to be based on cohort data. The assessment of the pandemic impact – beyond infection rates, morbidity and mortality – in the different migrant group is also an important added value of this paper, as data are still scarce in Europe.

Limitations include a potential bias due to self-declaration, the selective nature of participants to the online questionnaire (although comparability of samples has been assessed based on a selection of variables). Another limitation is the lack of multivariate analysis.

Probably, since the study is focusing on immigrants (or ethnic groups), which are a very specific population group, the title should better reflect the content. I would suggest, for example to talk about vulnerable sociodemographic groups, including immigrants.
