EVALUATION

Q1 Please summarize the main findings of the study.

The present study is the first to empirically identify adolescence as a critical period during which obesity affects human capital in adulthood. Human capital includes not only a single variable, but groups of variables including cognitive ability, non-cognitive skills, educational attainment, and health status.

Q 2 Please highlight the limitations and strengths.

The strengths of the study are clearly the longitudinal design, the comprehensive focus on a group of variables characterizing human capital, and the use of objective measurement in determining body weight. The use of BMI to classify obesity can be considered a limitation of the study. BMI does not take into account the distribution of adiposity.

Q3 Please provide your detailed review report to the authors. The editors prefer to receive your review structured in major and minor comments. The manuscript is very clearly and consistently written. I have only minor criticisms of the manuscript: Page 3 line 63 - define the abbreviation SES.

Page 4 line 67 - define the abbreviation BMI. Although the abbreviation BMI is defined on page 4 line 77, it should be defined correctly the first time it is used in the text.

Page 4 lines 69 and 70 - insert spaces after the period at the end of the sentence - ...of age (2012).Our analysis... ...age 42 (adulthood).The reason....

Page 5 line 94 - delete the extra space before the comma - ...from education , other...

Page 6 line 120 - insert missing space - ...qualification;(2)... and define the abbreviation CSE.

Page 11 line 228 - edit the spaces - ...for males ,which is....
