### Major Comment

The document requires editing of English language and style, there are errors and typos, such as title in Line 86, and missing references, in line 107.

Major comment: In section Data Synthesis, the authors affirmed that they excluded studies based on design. Please elaborate the idea to support this decision.

### Section Results

Major comment: Regarding Enforcement and traffic laws, one aspect that is suggested inside the category of multifaceted road safety laws are the aspect of obtaining a driving license. The tightening/improving of the requirements for obtaining a driving license is one of the ways to strengthen safety policies on the road, placing emphasis on motorcycle drivers or another group that is considered relevant. Any of the selected LMIC countries had seek to change/revise their driver license requisites, such as minimum age, theoretical and practical formation and methodology of examination?

Minor comment: Concerning speed management, the authors should mention other well-known trafficcalming measures such as restriction to vehicle circulation based on the license plate numbers. This type of policy had been implemented in cities such as Mexico City (Mexico), Santiago (Chile), Bogotá (Colombia), Beijing, and Jakarta, with mixed results in terms of road safety.

Minor comment: Regarding vehicle safety standards, the authors should mention policies that seek to replace obsolete and insecure vehicle models in public transport (buses and taxis) and freight transport.

Section Conclusion

Minor comment: The authors should not dismiss the availability of police records on road accident as start point to form a good quality crash data system. There are scientific research in some LMICs countries that employs police records to propose predictive models to characterize or event try to forecast road accidents severity.

Major comment: Please elaborate the ide in line 271 and 272, "We are currently investigating ways of improving road traffic death registration systems in LMICs using systems thinking approaches", it is not clear what the authors mean by "system thinking approaches".


